Bargello - Needlepoint Four-way Bargello is a modern invention, created in the 1960s and popularized in the 1970s by Dorothy Kaestner. With four-way Bargello, you start by dividing the canvas diagonally into quarters. Then, the same motif is worked in horizontal stitches in two quarters opposite from each other. If you think about how a four-way pattern is made, this makes sense. A Bargello pattern, such as the one below, is rotated on the diagonals.
